### **Summary**

Main Entry: Edwin Theodore Winkler Papers

Date Span: 1851-1941

Abstract: Southern Baptist minister, journalist, and denominational leader. He served as Corresponding Secretary of the Home Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention from 1872 to 1881. Collection includes correspondence, sermons and sermon books, addresses, biographical information, booklets, clippings, poems, writings, and other papers related to Winkler. Papers include letter asking him to serve as pastor to the Siloam Baptist Church in Marion, Alabama.

### **Biographical Sketch**

Edwin Theodore Winker (1823-1883) was a Baptist pastor, editor and writer. He was born on November 13, 1823 in Savannah, Georgia. He graduated from Brown University in 1843 and studied at Newton Theological Institution for two years. He returned to Georgia in 1845 and worked as assistant editor for the *Christian Index*. He was ordained to the ministry in 1846 and served as pastor to churches in Georgia and South Carolina. From 1852 to 1854 he was Corresponding Secretary for the Southern Baptist Publication Society and editor of the *Southern Baptist* in 1853. In 1854 he accepted the position of pastor for the First Baptist Church of Charleston, South Carolina. During the Civil War he left his pastorate and served as chaplain in the Confederate Army.

After the war, he returned to Charleston and became pastor of the Citadel Square Baptist Church until 1872 when he accepted the call of the Baptist church in Marion, Alabama. Two years later he became editor of the Alabama Baptist newspaper. For ten years he served as president of the Home Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention. Four times he was vice-president of the Southern Baptist Convention and preached the convention sermon in 1862. He published writings on missions, religious liberty, hymnody, and the religious instruction of African Americans. He died in Marion, Alabama, on Nov. 10, 1883.

#### **Scope and Content Note**

The collection includes a variety of material, although the bulk of the collection consists of sermons and writings of Winkler. The papers do include addresses, sermons and sermon books, biographical information, clippings, correspondence, poems, photographs, and writings.

The sermons date from 1851 to 1883, although the majority of the sermons cover the period from 1858 to 1860. Winkler would preach these sermons at various locations and more than one time. The sermons are all handwritten and vary in length, usually from two to eight pages. Some are full manuscripts of the sermons, while others are much briefer. Most sermons include the hymn numbers for the songs to sing at that service. It seems that the hymnal references are to Basil Manly's *Baptist Psalmody: A selection of hymns for the worship of God*, published by the Southern Baptist Publication Society. The first volume of sermons is numbered but the other three volumes follow a somewhat chronological order, but are not numbered. Some of the sermon books are indexed by topic and refer to page numbers in the volumes. The sermons cover a wide range of topics, such as the nature of God, the authority of Scriptures, discipleship, salvation, piety, baptism, and the Lord's supper. He does have some sermons related to the Civil War. He preached on the duties of soldiers and the coming war.

The listing below of sermons includes a date, when listed on the sermon. Sermons will sometimes have multiple dates with the earliest date listed on the folder listing.

Among the papers is the original letter (1872) inviting Winkler to accept the invitation of the Siloam Baptist Church in Marion, Alabama to become the pastor of that church. Also included is a resolution of appreciation of the church for Winkler's service.
