Summary

Main Entry: Joe W. Burton Correspondence

Date Span: 1958 – 1963

Abstract: Joe W. Burton worked for ten years as Secretary of Education with the Home Mission Board, was secretary of the Southern Baptist Convention from 1947 to 1965, and served as editor of *Home Life* magazine from 1947 to 1972. The Joe W. Burton correspondence deals with issues related to his role as Secretary of the Southern Baptist Convention from 1958 to 1963.

Biographical Sketch

Joe W. Burton served as editor of *Home Life* magazine published by the Baptist Sunday School Board from 1947 until his retirement in 1972. Dr. Burton started his career at the Baptist Sunday School Board in 1946, after serving ten years as Secretary of Education with the Home Mission Board. From 1947 – 1965, he was secretary of the Southern Baptist Convention, and he held pastorates in Texas, Georgia, and Tennessee.

Joe W. Burton was born September 7, 1907 in Miles, Texas, and died in Nashville, Tennessee in 1976. He married Lula Grace Williams and had three children – Mary Lou, John, and Robert. Dr. Burton received his Bachelor of Arts from Hardin – Simmons University, which later presented him with an honorary Doctor of Divinity and a Master of Theology from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. He did additional work at the University of Missouri's School of Journalism.

Scope and Content Note

The Joe W. Burton Correspondence (1958 – 1963) contains six folders in part of one document box, and is arranged alphabetically. The correspondence deals with issues related to Dr. Burton's role as Secretary of the Southern Baptist Convention, primarily procedural issues such as balloting and motion clarifications with limited discussion about racial integration.

Researchers should note that this collection is in the same document box as the Southern Baptist Convention Agency Charters (AR 156). Robert Turner transferred the materials from the Sunday School Board (now LifeWay) to the Southern Baptist Historical Library and Archives (then Historical Commission) in 1966.
